

Slide 1: This is the Huang Yan Dao landing permit, originally issued for the 1994 BS7H operation and renewed for the 1995 operation.








Slide 2: The 1995 BS7H license.





Slide 8: Olli, OH0XX, surveying another potential operating site.






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Slide 10: Chen Ping, BZ1HAM/BA1HAM, coolly handles the massive pileups.

Slide 12: The second operating site was established on this rock. Here, Chen operates while Olli and Petri look on.










